A. Introduction

- 1. There are a limited number of formulas when it comes to a 3:30-4 minute song. Lean into what works, we don't have to reinvent the wheel.
- 2. Congregational Participation is about creating expectation, reducing the amount of 'gotcha moments.'
- 3. Lyrical Considerations / Theme
- 4. Song Climax / Dynamics
- 5. BPM / Time Signature
- 6. Give sections of the song their own identity. "Play a part, not the chart"
- 7. Pick areas to lay out. It will make your entrance fresh and noticeable.
- 8. Listen to what is going on with the rest of the band.
 - a. What rhythms are being accentuated?
 - b. What is sounding, what is silent?

- 1. Groove Considerations
 - a. Working Backwards
 - b. Natural phrasing, Lyric spacing, Accents

- C. Pre-Chorus
 - 1. Distinction from verse and chorus
 - 2. Creating dynamic, or rhythmic anticipation for the chorus
 - 3. Filling to chorus, breaking, holding
- D. Chorus
 - 1. Driving
 - 2. Emptying/Laying Out
 - 3. Thinking ahead to future choruses.
